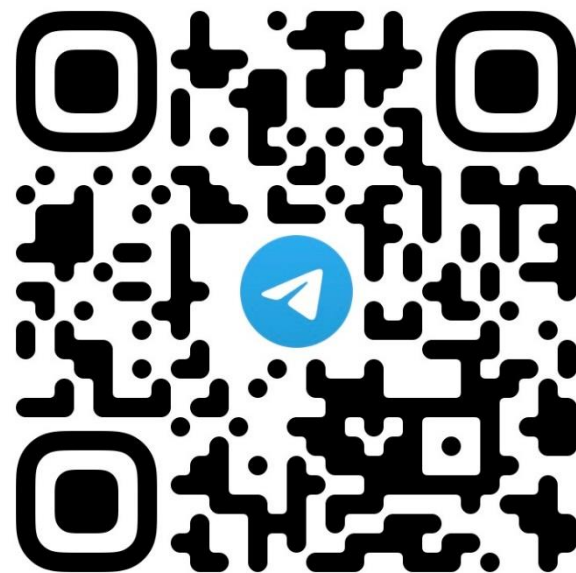
Welcome

Welcome Guide Revisions

The Student Welcome Guide and its policies are subject to change at any time without prior notice, and such changes take effect immediately. Students are responsible for familiarizing themselves with the most recent version of the Handbook, which is available through email.

Communications

NTU utilises electronic communication channels—including email and online platforms—to share important updates and information related to the programme. For many official communications, email to a student's NTU-issued email account will serve as the primary mode of notification. Emails sent by the summer programmes offered by NTU to these addresses will be considered received and acknowledged by the student.

Before and after the programme period—when NTU student email access is unavailable—official communications will be sent to the personal email address provided during application. Any electronic signature or acknowledgement submitted by the student through NTU systems or via their NTU email account will be regarded as valid and legally binding.

Such materials may be used now or in the future for educational, promotional, or institutional purposes.

Summer Session In-Person Attendance Policy

GEM Trailblazer Summer programme is an in-person coursework programme, and students are expected to stay in Singapore for the full duration of the programme.

Because the summer schedule is shorter and more intensive, attending all classes is very important. Being on campus gives you the chance to take part in fun and meaningful activities outside of class—like local trips, cultural events, workshops, and student gatherings. This is to make sure you have access to all the services and support available to NTU students and to help you make the most of your time here.

Students should not skip class, leave the programme early, or be away for long periods—unless there is a serious reason like a personal emergency or health issue. If that happens, please inform the course instructor and summerNTU@ntu.edu.sg as soon as possible. Any final exams, projects, or coursework should be discussed directly with your instructors. These experiences help you connect with others, explore new ideas, and enjoy student life at NTU. For more details, you can check our website about accommodation and campus life.

Before You Arrive

Application, Acceptance & Enrolment

1. Students must be nominated by home institutions or provide the NTU's Letter of Certification (LoC) before you are invited to apply for GEM Trailblazer Summer programme.
2. Please accept or decline the offer in the Study Abroad Portal or send an email directly to summerNTU@ntu.edu.sg promptly when you receive a conditional offer from NTU Singapore.
3. An Enrolment and Welcome email will be issued once your application has been approved by NTU.
4. All course registrations have been completed for GEM Trailblazer Summer Programme before classes commence. Students are not allowed to withdraw or drop courses once classes commence.

Travelling To Singapore

Immigration

1. For a smooth travel experience, please prepare and complete the following prior to your arrival in Singapore:
 - a) SG Arrival Card, up to 3 days prior to arrival, at <https://eservices.ica.gov.sg/sgarrivalcard/>
 - b) Immigration clearance in Singapore
 - c) Comply with Singapore's health protocols
2. Refer to the ICA website at <https://www.ica.gov.sg/enter-transit-depart/entering-singapore> for detailed information and latest updates regularly as changes may be implemented at short notice.

Cost of Living

1. Singapore official currency is Singapore Dollars (SGD). Credit cards such as VISA, Mastercard, American Express, Maestro and PLUS can be used in Singapore. You may withdraw cash from most of the Automated Teller Machines (ATM) which can be found within the campus. Alternatively, you can visit the nearest shopping mall, Jurong Point Shopping Centre, for individual banking needs. There is also an OCBC Bank located within the campus.
2. Many people in Singapore spend an average of about S\$10 per meal. Students must be financially prepared for the full-time summer study at NTU during the 2 or 4 weeks while staying in NTU on-campus housing.

Travelling To NTU

1. Singapore is a small city-state. Students are advised to travel by air via the main international airport, Changi Airport.
2. The main campus of NTU is located in the southwest region of Singapore. The NTU campus is easily accessible using public transportation, such as buses and the Mass Rapid Transit (MRT) system. The MRT stations nearest the NTU campus are Pioneer Station and Boon Lay Station. Both are a short bus ride from the central area of the campus. 3. Students may also opt for taking a taxi or using ride-hailing services like Grab/Gojek from Changi Airport to NTU. This option offers a direct and comfortable journey, especially convenient for those with heavy luggage or arriving during off-peak hours. Taxi fares typically range from S\$30 to S\$50, depending on the time of day and traffic conditions. Additional surcharges apply, such as an airport surcharge of S\$3 to S\$5, and peak-hour surcharges of 25% during certain hours. Do note that fares and surcharges are subject to change based on traffic and other factors.

While You are Here

On Arrival And Accommodation

1. Upon arrival, you may take local transport from the airport and check into your assigned hall directly. The room key can be collected from the Hall Admin Office.
2. You are guaranteed on-campus housing. Your allocated hall will be sent to you via email one week before the start of the programme.
3. Your student hostel room is furnished with a bed, mattress, study table, chair, wardrobe, bookshelf, and soft board (to pin notes on, etc.). Ethernet connection is available in each room. Wi-Fi is available only in common rooms. You may consider bringing your own personal items or you may purchase them upon your arrival in Singapore.

NTU Pass

Use the app to access campus facilities and borrow library materials.

Please complete the following steps in the Acceptance Portal two working days after obtaining your matriculation number:

1. Confirm that your name (including its sequence) matches the one printed on your NRIC/ passport.
2. Upload the following by clicking on the 'Provide Passport Details' option in the Matriculation Portal
3. Upload a recent passport-sized photograph:
 - (i) The photograph must meet the following requirements: 354 pixels wide by 472 pixels high (or 35 mm wide by 45 mm high) without border and taken within the last three months;
 - (ii) Taken full face without headgear, unless the applicant habitually wears a headgear in accordance with religious or racial customs. The headgear must not hide the applicant's facial features;
 - (iii) The facial image must be between 25 mm and 35 mm from chin to crown;
 - (iv) Coloured photograph taken against plain white background with a matt or semi-matt finish; and
 - (v) The image must not contain any shadow in the background.

There are various shuttle bus routes serving the campus.

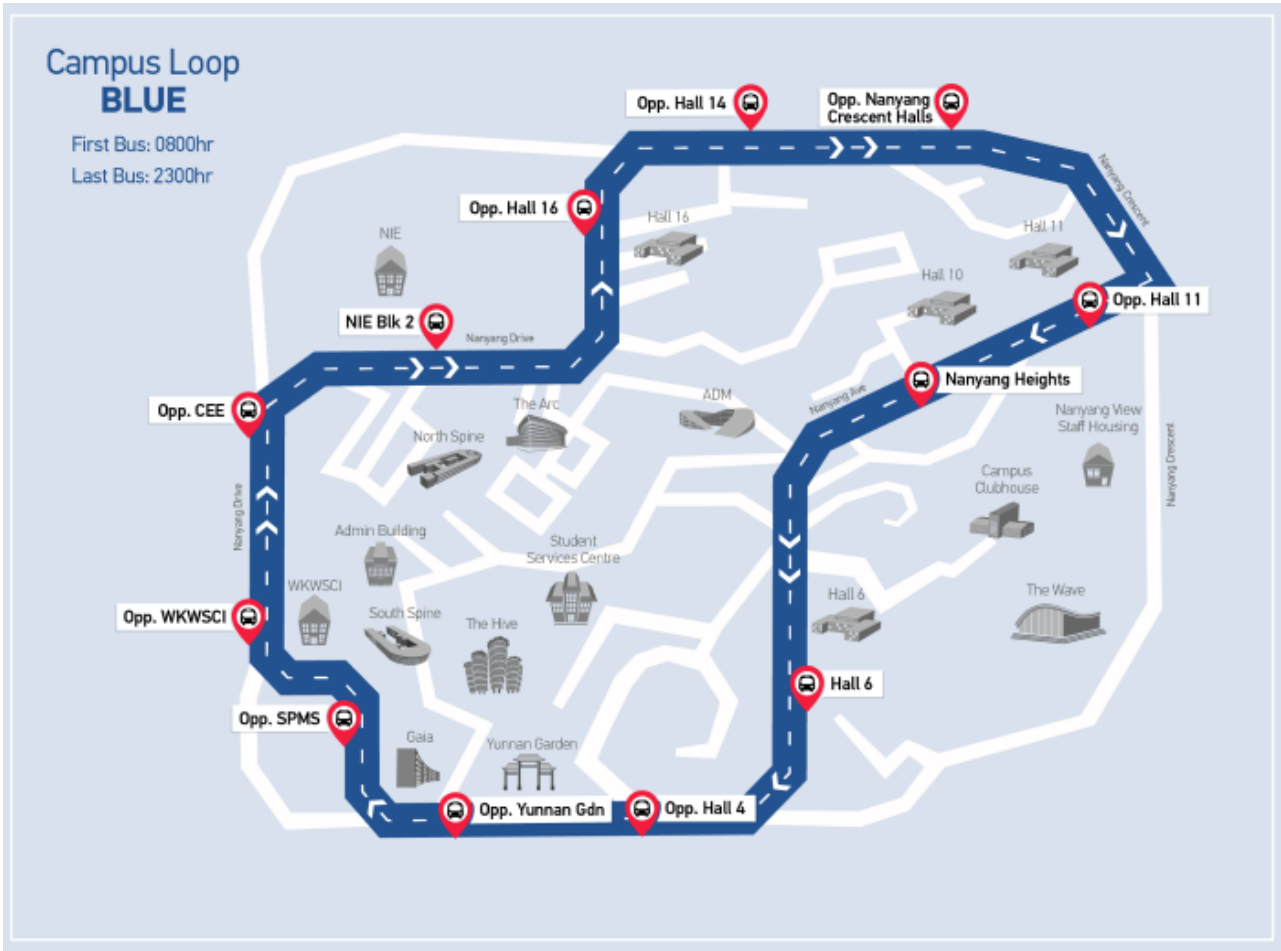

CAMPUS LOOP - BLUE (CL-B)

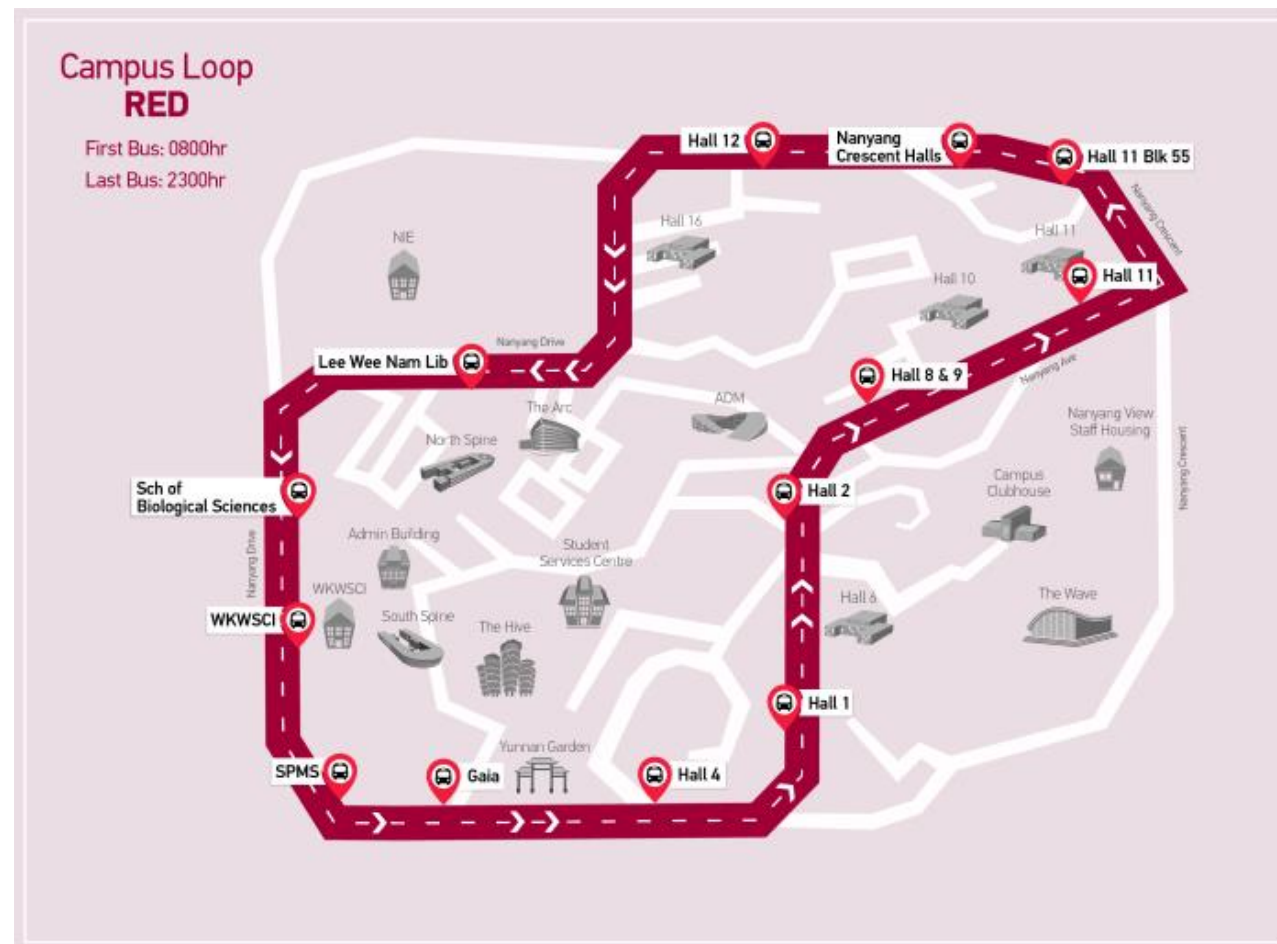

NTU Code of Conduct and Programme Expectations

Student Responsibilities

All students are expected to conduct themselves in a manner consistent with the University's education and research mission. Each student is individually responsible and accountable for their own conduct. As members of the University community, all students are collectively responsible and accountable for upholding high standards of conduct.

Compliance with University rules

Students must be aware of and comply with:

- University Code of Conduct
- Student Code of Conduct
- University statutes, rules, regulations, directives, policies and procedures • Singapore law
- The laws of any country that they visit during their time as an NTU student.
- The rules of any university, institution or organisation that they visit, attend or work at during their time as an NTU student.

A student cannot reasonably claim innocence of a violation of the Code on the grounds of ignorance.

A student has to declare all criminal convictions, reprimands, warnings, police cautions, and any pending prosecutions against him / her in Singapore (including SAF Military Courts, SPF or SCDF Disciplinary Board) and any other country. Any intentional failure to make such a disclosure will itself be considered as misconduct that may subject the student to disciplinary measures.

If a student suspects that a fellow student is acting in a manner inconsistent with the Code, the student is expected to report the suspected misconduct to the Director of Student Affairs as soon as possible.

Integrity in Learning and Research

The University endeavours to inculcate a spirit of learning and growth. Students are expected to maintain academic integrity and also respect and comply with the conventions of academic scholarship as outlined in the University's Student Academic Integrity Policy.

Students are responsible for:

- Being knowledgeable about their programme and course requirements.
- Attending classes and submitting work in a timely manner.
- Informing a relevant faculty member as soon as possible of anything which may affect their studies.
- Being prepared for and taking advantage of all learning opportunities, within and beyond the curriculum, and moving towards intellectual independence.
- Actively developing their social, academic, professional and communication skills. • Providing considered and honest feedback to the University on the quality of learning, teaching and the University experience.
- Being prepared for, and actively contributing as a member of any University committees.

As a research-intensive institution, the University attaches great importance and is committed to the highest level of good research practice with a policy of zero tolerance for research misconduct. Students involved in research, whether at undergraduate or graduate level, are required to sign a declaration that they have read, understood and agreed to abide by the University's Research Integrity Policy and Procedures and to undertake any appropriate training specified by the University. In addition, all involved in research involving human subjects must adhere to the requirements of the Institutional Review Board, and those undertaking research involving animals must comply with the requirements of the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee.

Respect for Others

To enable students to develop as individuals, the University is committed to providing an environment of equal opportunity, free of harassment and disruptive behaviour.

Students must treat fellow students and other community members with respect, courtesy and collegiality. The University welcomes diversity and encourages students to share and develop ideas in a stimulating atmosphere of mutual respect.

Students are expected to show respect and be sensitive towards the beliefs, customs and cultures of others. Students are expected to respect the opinions of others and to engage in informed intellectual debate.

The safety of all community members is a shared responsibility. Students must not endanger the safety of other members of the University or the community at large. Students must comply with the University's occupational health and safety requirements.

Students are expected to avoid conduct that disrupts the teaching, learning, research, or professional activities of other students or community members.

Standards of conduct that apply in face-to-face interaction must also be maintained in an NTU student's use of online and social media.

Confidentiality and Privacy

In the course of studies or other dealings with the University, students may have access to information that is classified as confidential or proprietary and intended for restricted circulation only. Students must treat such information with due respect for its sensitivity and confidentiality, in compliance with all applicable laws and agreements and the University's policies and principles on the use, protection and disclosure of restricted information.

Restricted information must not be disclosed to any party without the prior approval of the relevant University authority and without first putting in place the confidentiality agreements or non-disclosure documents and other safeguards which may be required by the University.

Students are expected to respect the privacy of all University community members.

Representing Oneself and the University

Students must represent not only themselves but also the University to the best of their ability. NTU students are expected to be mindful of the University's vision and mission when representing the University. Students are expected to act in a manner that promotes the interests and welfare of the University community, as well as the reputation and dignity of the University.

Students are expected to be socially responsible when consuming alcohol and when accompanying friends who are consuming alcohol.

Students are expected to dress appropriately, as befitting the status of university students, as well as the occasion.

Use of University Resources and Facilities

Students are expected to use all University resources and facilities responsibly and in accordance with applicable laws, rules and policies.

The University provides resources and facilities for use by all members of the University community. As these resources and facilities are shared, members must be considerate to others by using them in an appropriate manner.

Students must report any faults or concerns about University resources and facilities to the relevant point of contact as soon as possible. Acts of theft, vandalism and intentional damage undermine the community spirit and will deny others the benefit of using shared resources and facilities.

i. Venues

Students are expected to be considerate of the needs of others, and be prepared to cooperate with other users to maximise opportunities for all users. All venues must be returned to their original condition after use.

ii. IT resources

IT resources such as computers and internet access are provided by the University to aid student learning and research. Students are responsible for maintaining their computer account and proper use of the University's IT resources. For more information about the use of IT resources, visit the Centre for IT Services (CITS) website.

iii. Equipment and materials for loan

All equipment and materials loaned from the University must be returned in their original condition in a timely manner. Wear and tear due to normal use is expected.

iv. Library Resources

All resources provided by Library are subject to third party licence agreements. Usage of such resources are restricted to non-commercial, educational, scholarly and research purposes only. Students shall abide by the policies published on Library's website ("Library Policies") when using all materials and e-resources made available by Library. Any student who fails to comply with Library Policies or found to be misusing Library resources may be subject to disciplinary measures.

Safety

NTU is an open and large campus. Every NTU student has an important part to play in ensuring a safe and secure campus. Be aware of your vulnerability and utilize safety tips to protect yourself and your valuables. Avoid presenting yourself as a target, such as by carrying large amounts of cash, or by leaving valuables unattended.

When You Depart

Check Out of Housing

1. Ensure that your room and shared common areas are clean prior to Check-Out.
 - If the conditions of the Room and shared common areas are found to be not satisfactory or unacceptable during/or after Check-Out, cleaning/damage costs (starting from a minimum sum of S\$100) shall be imposed.
2. Ensure that you have removed your belongings from the Room prior to Check-Out, including bicycles from the bicycle shed (where applicable).
 - The Hall Admin Office shall dispose of belongings left behind without liability. Any bulky items, e.g. Fridge or furniture etc., left in the rooms shall be regarded as unwanted and shall be removed by the Hall Admin Office. Any cost incurred from the removal or disposal and/or extensive cleaning can be chargeable.
3. On your check out date, the Room Key(s) shall be returned to the Hall Admin Office.
 - Please place the items in a sealed envelope clearly labeled with your full name, matriculation number, and room number. On your check-out date, kindly deposit the envelope into the designated drop box located outside the Hall Office.
 - If the key(s) are not completely returned, check-out shall not be deemed to have taken place, and you shall be liable to continue to pay all applicable charges until the complete return of key(s). The responsibility is on you to ensure complete return of key(s).
 - A fine of \$50 will be imposed for each time a key fob or access card being lost, damaged, deformed, or defaced.
